### SCHOOL TARGETS AND STRATEGIES

#### **Mathematics**

- Percentage of students in grades 1-5 who meet the MAP Math RIT will grow from 41.1% to 44.1% by the end of 2017-2018 school year.
- Percentage of EL students who meet the MAP Math RIT will grow from 7.3% to 17.3% by the end of the 2017-2018 school year.
- In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will participate in professional learning about characteristics of rich tasks led by MST and classroom teachers (monthly).
- In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will participate in collaborative planning led by MST to select/create rigorous task (quarterly).
- In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will utilize rich mathematics tasks within instruction (daily).

## **English Language Arts**

- Percentage of students in grades K-2 who meet the HCPSS expected benchmark levels will grow from 70% to 74% by the end of the 2017-2018 school year.
- Percentage of EL students in grades K-2 who meet the HCPSS expected benchmark level will grow from 39% to 49% by the end of the 2017-2018 school year.
- In order to impact language arts performance, staff will participate in professional learning utilizing formative assessments led by RST and classroom teachers (monthly).
- In order to impact language arts performance, staff will participate in collaborative planning led by the RST based on formative assessment data (quarterly).
- In order to impact language arts performance, staff will utilize
  formative assessments to determine instructional focus on a daily basis
  and inform targeted interventions for students working below HCPSS
  expectations (daily).
